Paolo Graziano is Professor of Political Science at the University of Padua and Incoming Scholar at Urban Futures.

While the debate on ecological and social concerns is growing, recent developments revealed a trade-off in

terms of potentially conflicting policies and policz goals. The talk addresses the following questions: did the European Union take an 'eco-social' path? If so, how and why? By adopting a post-functionalist approach, it analyses the growing intertwining of social and environmental policies at the EU level and tries to explain its genesis by focusing on the role of the actors involved.

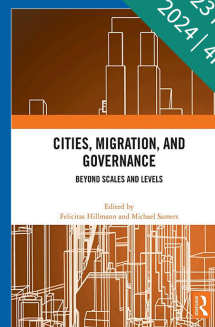
